Vision

The States' Startup Ranking Exercise is integral in aligning and boosting the key players of the startup economy, synergize innovation, and development among the States and Union Territories to cumulatively forge the path ahead for India's self-sustenance and self-reliance.

- The Ranking Exercise will employ a systematic approach towards recognising States and Union Territories with mature and nascent Startup Ecosystems.
- > The exercise will provide impetus to all enablers within States and Union Territories to maintain a conducive environment for Startups.
- The intent is to establish an institutional framework for the Golden Triangle of Government, Private Sector, and Academia to join hands and augment the Startup Ecosystem in the country.

General Principles

- 1. The framework would evaluate progress made from 1st January 2023 to 30th September 2024. Consequently, submission of documentary evidence by states and union territories through the States' Startup Ranking Portal will need to be submitted by 20th October 2024.
- 2. For the purposes of evaluation, all States and UTs have been divided into two categories: **Category A and Category B**. Category A has been further divided into two sub-categories, namely A1 and A2.
- 3. The scores of various aspects in the framework may be divided into the following categories:
 - a) Absolute Scoring
 - b) Relative Scoring
 - c) Private Ecosystem Assessment
 - d) Feedback Survey Scoring

4. Scoring Details:

- a) <u>Absolute Scoring</u> Scores will be awarded basis the documentary evidence submitted by states and UTs in compliance with reform areas and action points of the 5th edition of the framework.
- b) Relative Scoring Relative Scoring will be conducted separately for Category A and Category B. The State/UT with maximum accepted value of metric will serve as benchmark. States/UTs will be awarded score according to their percentile, vis-à-vis maximum value of metric for any State/UT.
- c) <u>Private Ecosystem Research</u> Scores will be awarded on the basis of private ecosystem mapping and will amount to 10% of the total score.
- d) <u>Feedback Survey Scoring</u> Scores will be awarded on the basis of survey responses and will amount to 15% of the total score.

Private Ecosystem Mapping

Mapping of the Private Ecosystem will be undertaken to analyze the extent of synergies being created between the private ecosystem and Startups within each State and UT. Through this exercise, the quality and quantity of the ecosystem created by private stakeholders will be evaluated across States and Union Territories, covering access to private capital, Startup support infrastructure, industry-specific support, corporate innovation, market access, entrepreneurial culture, global expansion, ecosystem connectivity, and diversity and inclusion initiatives, providing insights into the dynamic Startup landscape.

The exercise will map the following criteria across states and UTs to understand the private ecosystem:

- 1. Number of Soonicorn and Unicorn Startups
- 2. Private Infrastructure
- 3. Access to Private Capital
- 4. Entrepreneurial Culture and Talent Development
- 5. Ecosystem Connectivity and Community Engagement
- 6. Diversity and Inclusion

This exercise will map the support provided directly or indirectly by private ecosystem stakeholders such as investors, accelerators, coworking spaces, pantheon, and unicorns.

It will evaluate the quality and quantity of the ecosystem created by private stakeholders to encourage further improvement and foster a conducive environment for Startups in the states & UTs.

Feedback Mechanism

Feedback Mechanism

- Registered stakeholders with the Bharat Startup Ecosystem Registry of Department for Promotion of Industry and Internal Trade (DPIIT) will be considered as "Registered stakeholders" for research study.
- States and UTs shall provide contact details of all registered stakeholders in the State/UT in the format shared by DPIIT.
- 50% positive feedback will result in acceptance of the survey results.

- 2. Do you know about any mentorship support provided within your State/UT?
- 3. Do you know about any kind of accelerator programs in your State/UT?

- 5. Does your Startup have a female founder, and have you received any kind of support or special incentives?
- 6. Have you resolved any query you had using the grievance portal or helpline for Startups in your State/UT?
- 7. Have you received any kind of funding support?
- 8. Have you attended any kind of event to connect with investors?
- 9. Have you received any opportunity to showcase your product/service either domestically or internationally or both?
- 10. Does Startup focus on renewable energy, climate change or sustainability? If yes, has your Startup received any kind of support from your State/UT?
- 11. Did you attend any pitching session/networking event/workshop?

The categorization in this year's framework aims to bring uniformity in the evaluation process and bring all the States and UTs on a level-playing field.

While there will be two distinct categories - Category A and Category B, a further subdivision has been incorporated within Category A as listed below.

1. Under Category A,

- Category A1 includes all State/UTs with a population of more than 5 crores.
- Category A2 includes all State/UTs with a population of more than 1 crore and less than 5 crores.¹
- 2. Category B includes all States/UTs with a population of less than 1 crore.²



- 7. A multi-department program will be counted as one program from the government department leading the program for Category B states / UTs.
- 8. Details of support provided should include the type of support given by department, extent of support and date of provision.
- 9. Details about the existing schemes and policies that have been renewed recently or are under the process of renewal.
- 10. Response for this Action Point shall be considered for purpose of evaluation only if the benefits have been provided to Startups, incubators or other Startup ecosystem stakeholders during the period of consideration.

Recommended:

- 11. Details about the Active State Startup Policy, and composition of the Dedicated Team.
- 12. Activities undertaken to support Startups in collaboration with the Nodal Department shall be considered for the purpose of evaluation, given that department- wise details of support provided are made available.
- 13. Government orders and notifications are not mandatory for Hackathon and other such events.
- 14. In addition to Startup specific support in policies, provisions related to ease of doing business, infrastructure development and entrepreneurial support can also be submitted. Sector specific policies with these provisions can also be submitted, given that beneficiary list of Startups is submitted along with.

- 1. Official Notification/Government Order to be provided for the purpose of evaluation identifying the priority sectors of the State / UT.
- 2. States and Union Territories should be able to identify its sectoral, regional and local strengths to focus on strategic reforms in these sectors.
- States should have a clear definition of which Startups qualify to be a part of Priority Sector and this information should be published in the public domain.
- 4. Details of incentives provided to the Startups should entail provision of type of incentive, extent of incentive, and date of provision.
- Beneficiary list of Startups pertaining to support provided is mandated to be submitted.
- 6. The incentives provided for evaluation should have been availed during the period of consideration.

- 7. A Priority Sector can be identified as a sector within a State or UT that is considered the strength of that respective State / UT. Identification of the same will provide an impetus to develop that specific sector(s) for the development of the Startup economy of the state.
- 8. Priority Sectors (depending on State / UT focus) may include but not limited to Agriculture, Handloom & Textile, Chips and Semiconductor, Manufacturing, Fisheries, Food Processing, Oil and Gas, Tourism, DeepTech, FinTech and others.
- Startups in Priority Sectors may include Startups generating employment opportunities, innovations focused on development in these sectors or other such criteria.
- 10. Scheme document(s) covering incentives will be considered for the purpose of evaluation. It is not mandatory to include the clause in the State Startup Policy.
- Regulations may be made considering long-term impact of the technology or business model.

- An Entrepreneurship Course to aid students with their entrepreneurial goals active mentorship, pitch sessions and opportunities for networking with investors.
 - Provide courses in entrepreneurship as part of the curriculum.
- Conduct ideation and brainstorming workshops at regular intervals during academic year.
- An Entrepreneurship cell's activities may include bi-annual sessions with Startup India to inform students of the incentives and benefits.
- Create and facilitate internship opportunities for students to be able to shadow entrepreneurs.
- Institute a deferred placement mechanism, to provide students the opportunity to start their own ventures and defer their education.



- 10. All pages should be accessible in the local/regional language.
- 11. Query portal should be a part of the State Startup portal.
- 12. Query response timeframe should be mentioned in the public domain through a state notification/government order/FAQ.
- 13. The grievance redressal mechanism can also include an array of integrated features including but not limited to SMSs, website chatbots, helpline numbers etc. in addition to an existing web platform linked through the State Startup Portal.
- 14. States / UTs should also submit sample of grievance messages, reopening of queries / grievance messages post closure, if any, and other details concerned.

- 15. State Startup Portal to be equipped with Cloud Infrastructure for Data Security and Storage.
- 16. This Action Point will encapsulate <u>online mechanism</u> to provide all types of funding support to Startups, including seed funding, subsidized loans, government grants, sustenance allowance, debt or equity financing through incubators, venture funding, amongst others.
- 17. A virtual demo of the State Startup Website may be requested, if required.


Guidelines

Mandatory:

- 1. Unique lists of State-supported incubators and accelerators to be shared.
- 2. Incubators / Acceleration Centers should be listed on the State Startup Portal along with their contact details. Contact details of the State Point of Contact for respective incubators shall also be provided for the purpose of evaluation.
- 3. The list of beneficiaries will only include Startups which have received support during the period of consideration.
- 4. Details of specific support provided in Incubators and Acceleration Centers to Startups (E.g., technical assistance, workspace, labs, testing zones, etc.) must be shared for the purpose of evaluation.
- 5. Subsidized Incubation provided by State government through private incubators will also be considered for the purpose of evaluation.
- 6. Incubation provided through incubators of other States, subsidized by the State government, will also be considered for the purpose of evaluation.
- 7. Support provided by the State government for Acceleration Programs should be within the period of consideration even if the program is in progress and results are yet to be declared.
- 8. Existing Acceleration Programs will only be accepted if Startups from the particular state receive a specific quota or support in it.






