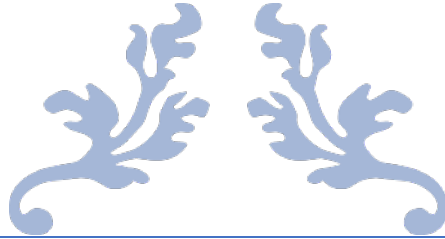

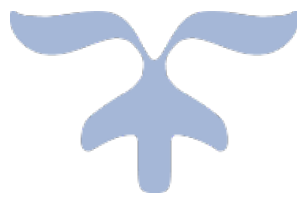

# STATES' STARTUP RANKING 2022 Framework

---

On Support to Startup Ecosystems



**#startupindia**

## General Principles

1. The framework would evaluate progress made from **1<sup>st</sup> August 2021 to 31<sup>st</sup> December 2022<sup>1</sup>**.
2. For the purposes of evaluation, all States and UTs have been divided into two categories: **Category A and Category B**.
3. The scores of different Action Points may be divided into the following categories:
  - a) **Absolute Scoring**
  - b) **Relative Scoring**
  - c) **Research Survey Scoring**

### Scoring in Action Points with Absolute Scoring

1. Scores will be awarded on the basis of compliance of documentary evidence.

### Scoring in Action Points with Relative Scoring

1. Relative Scoring will be conducted separately for Category A and Category B
2. Scores will be awarded on the basis of compliance of documentary evidence. The State/UT with maximum accepted value of metric will serve as benchmark. States/UTs will be awarded score according to their percentile, vis-à-vis maximum value of metric for any State/UT

### Research Survey Scoring

1. Scores will be awarded on the basis of survey responses and will amount to 15% of the total score.

<sup>1</sup> The consideration period has been defined keeping in mind the impact of the COVID-19 pandemic. The consideration period from the State Startup Ranking 5.0 will be for the calendar year, from 1st January 2023 to 31st December 2023

### Feedback Mechanism

- Registered Startups with the Department for Promotion of Industry and Internal Trade (DPIIT) and/or States/UTs will be considered as “Registered Startups” for research study.
- States and UTs shall provide contact details of all registered startups in the State/UT in the format shared by DPIIT.
- The sample size for respondents from each State and Union Territory will be taken through the following formula

$$n_0 = \frac{Z^2 pq}{e^2}$$

Where:

- e is the desired level of precision (i.e. the margin of error)
- p is the (estimated) proportion of the population which has the attribute in question (registered startups in the State/UT)
- q is 1 - p

### Combining the Overall Scores

1. Based on scores on all action points, overall scores for each State or UT shall be calculated.
2. Within each category, States and UTs will be graded based on their relative performance into 3-5 grades.
3. Best performing States/UTs shall also be graded in each framework pillar to recognize their performance.
4. In addition, individual officers shall also be awarded for their significant contribution to strengthen Startup ecosystem under their jurisdictions.

### Tentative Questionnaire:

**Key:** *If the respondent answers in affirmative to the initial question, it will be scored. Follow up questions will not be scored.*

All responses will be recorded including qualitative responses. The responses will be recorded in the following order:

- I. If initial response is “Yes”
  - a. Have you availed of the policy/mechanism?
  - b. How long did it take you to access the policy/mechanism?
- II. If initial response is “No”
  - a. Would you like to avail of the policy?
  - b. What would you like additionally included in the policy?

1. Are you aware of the State/UT startup policy in your State/UT?
2. Do you know about the incubation support provided by your State/UT?
3. Do you know about the funding schemes and benefits provided by your State/UT?
4. Do you know about the Government procurement opportunities provided by your State/UT for startups?
5. Do you know about the mentorship support provided by the State/UT startup team?
6. Do you know about the grievance portal or helpline for startups in your State/UT?
7. Do you know about the benefits provided to female entrepreneurs in your State/UT?
8. Do you know about the programs conducted by State/UT startup team in educational institutions?
9. Do you know about the State/UT policies supporting startups who are working on rural impact or in rural areas?
10. Do you know about the State/UT policies supporting startups who are working on climate change and sustainability?
11. Do you know about the State/UT policies supporting startups working in the circular economy, i.e. startups working with a focus on reuse, reduce, recycle and repurpose?

## Survey Research Framework Explanation

Based on the Cochran's formula shared, the following will be the formula used to assess the number of survey respondents necessary.

$$n = \frac{NZ^2\sigma^2}{(N - 1)e^2 + Z\sigma^2}$$

$n$  = sample size (unit) or the number of startups for survey

$N$  = population size (unit) is the total number of startups in the ecosystem as shared by the state

$\sigma$  = standard deviation of the sample

Standard deviation is a number used to tell how measurements for a group are spread out from the average (mean or expected value). A low standard deviation means that most of the numbers are close to the average, while a high standard deviation means that the numbers are more spread out.

Example:

Consider a **group** having the following eight numbers:

2, 4, 4, 4, 5, 5, 7, 9

These eight numbers have the average (mean) of 5:

$$\frac{2 + 4 + 4 + 4 + 5 + 5 + 7 + 9}{8} = 5$$

To calculate the population standard deviation, first find the difference of each number in the list from the mean. Then **square** the result of each difference:

$$\begin{aligned}(2 - 5)^2 &= (-3)^2 = 9 & (5 - 5)^2 &= 0^2 = 0 \\(4 - 5)^2 &= (-1)^2 = 1 & (5 - 5)^2 &= 0^2 = 0 \\(4 - 5)^2 &= (-1)^2 = 1 & (7 - 5)^2 &= 2^2 = 4 \\(4 - 5)^2 &= (-1)^2 = 1 & (9 - 5)^2 &= 4^2 = 16\end{aligned}$$

Next, find the average of these values (sum divided by the number of numbers). Last, take the square root:

$$\sqrt{\frac{(9 + 1 + 1 + 1 + 0 + 0 + 4 + 16)}{8}} = 2$$

The standard deviation here is 2.

$e$  = acceptable sampling error/margin of error or confidence interval

Margin of error, also called the confidence interval, is a statistical measurement of difference between survey results and the population value, expressed as a percentage. Within the survey ecosystem, the margin of error measures the difference between your survey results and how accurately they reflect the views of the overall population.

$z = z$  value at reliability level or significance level.  $z$ -score (also called a standard score) gives you an idea of how far from the mean a data point is.

- Reliability level 95% or significance level 0.05;  $z = 1.96$
- Reliability level 99% or significance level 0.01;  $z = 2.58$

A  $z$ -score of 2.58 means that it is 2.58 standard deviations raw score away from the population mean.

So, following the formula defined above, the number of survey respondents will be calculated as shown below:

$$n = \frac{NZ^2\sigma^2}{(N - 1)e^2 + Z^2\sigma^2}$$
$$n = \frac{400 \times (1.96)^2 \times (15)^2}{(400 - 1)(5)^2 + 1.96^2 \times (15)^2} = 33 \text{ survey units}$$

Where 400 is the total population size, i.e., all the startups in the list submitted by the state. For this, population, 33 startups will be reached out for the surveys.

#### **Methodology:**

The feedback mechanism for States' Startup Ranking Framework 2022 will ascertain the number of respondents based on the data shared by states. States will share startup list with their districts.

#### **Sample Illustrative:**

The number of respondents for each state is highlighted in table 1. The mathematical formula and its values are highlighted in *illustration 1* for better understanding. A sample question is shared below for clarity.

**Question 1:** Are you aware of the state startup website?

**Response:** Yes or No.

**Question 1.1:** If yes, have you ever used or accessed it? If no, then no further questions.

**Case 1:** In case of 'State 3' in *table 1* over 50% of the respondents respond to Question 1 as yes hence the state will be provided a score of 1.

**Case 2:** In case of 'State 6' in *table 1*, less than 50% of the respondents respond to Question 1 as yes, the state will be provided a score of 0.

**Case 3:** In case of 'State 5' in *table 1*, 50% of the respondents respond to Question 1 as yes, the state will be provided a score of 0.

The following illustration highlights a sample size for 10 states based on the data shared by them.

### Process of Scoring:

1. All the States and UTs are required to submit documentary evidence for the claimed number of programs, as specified in the Action Points.
2. The claimed programs are accepted or rejected as per the documentary evidence requirement specified in the Action Point. All the documentary evidence requested for in the Action Point are required to be submitted for the program to be considered for evaluation.

### Categorization for States and UTs

The categorization in this years' framework aims to bring uniformity in the evaluation process and bring all the States and UTs on a level-playing field.

- **Category A** includes all State/UTs with a population of more than 1 crore<sup>2</sup>
- **Category B** includes all States/UTs with a population of less than 1 crore<sup>3</sup>

15. All information should be available on the State Startup Portal during the period of consideration
16. All pages should be accessible in the local/regional language
17. A virtual demo of the website may be requested if required
